

## **Sports Funding 2014-15**

The new school Sports funding is ring-fenced for PE and sport development in Schools. In our School, this funding will be used in particular ways to promote sustainable Physical Education, Healthy Lifestyles and Competition. The impact this money has will be a key priority for Ofsted in the future. It is therefore extremely important to take into account the opportunities and activities that our pupils are already engaged in so we can offer new sports and build on what children already do.

### **Sports Funding: £8000 for S and TW + £5 per pupil = £16 190**

- **Employing specialist PE teacher to work alongside teachers in lessons to increase their subject knowledge and confidence in PE,**
- **Providing places for pupils in after-school sports clubs .**

KS1 and KS2 Coaching support for staff and lessons for children 1x lesson each week using specialist coaches– Gymnastics, rugby, football and multiskills for KS1 **£560**

After-school sports club places to allow training for competitions and differentiated provision . **£1020**

- **Providing cover staff to release teachers for professional development in PE and sport**

PLT course (£30), follow up meeting with PE/Sport Governor (half day supply). **£150**

- **Buying into existing local sports networks such as school sports partnerships;**
- **Paying cluster staff to run competitions across the Cluster**

Various tournaments throughout the year : swimming, gymnastics, hockey, netball, football and athletics (**£255**)

- **Providing extra, additional activities for an enhanced PE curriculum**

Skip to be fit day £380, Dance Federation day £400, Visit to Man Utd £400 **£1180**

- **Purchasing of specialist PE equipment to improve provision across Federation**

Equipment audit and upgrade so fit for purpose -to date building bricks for outdoor play in EYFS £334, foam springboard £190, scooterx2 £339 Wii sports games £27football £10. Purchase of bespoke PE play shed for Early years unit £2340 **£3240**

Purchase of Trim Trail to enhance KS2 outdoor environment **£9581**

## **Impact to date**

### **Competition and performance**

Equipment is being upgraded on sport by sport basis. Wider range equipment has allowed for greater inclusion and potential for challenge through more specialised equipment. Sports shed is well maintained (need to review provision at TW following re-siting of KS1)

Long Term planning (established through PE subject leader time) ensures progression of skills across academic years and Key Stages. Evaluated lesson plans being built up. Tracking shows that pupil's skills are improving.

Team successes at Cluster Sports events – Second in Netball Nov 2014, Second Place in Cluster Hockey March 2015, Winners in Football event held with Richmondshire cluster March 2015. Pupils represented school in finals stage of the x country. One pupils listed as G&T in PE

School has produced teams to enter the tennis festival and gymnastics festivals this year. More matches home and away arranged for May 2015, parents encouraged to support – newsletter.

After school sports club is popular EY/KS1/KS2 uptake – up to 15 pupils per session. Pupil's choice of activity and competition training. Dance showcased to parents Feb 2015 –Dance training (AJ Dance) (see pupil comments in newsletter and display). Gymnastics club also performed their work to parents in March 2015

### **Extra and additional activities**

Schools/outdoor learning work increasingly embedded throughout the curriculum through regular use of local woodland . Engagement of all learners: Positive pupil feedback re practical and useful activities such as shelter building, small world imaginative activities Curriculum opportunities being taken (EY (maths) Learning walks around Snape).

Subsidised Holiday School sports providers served to encourage active holiday time and reduce drop off in pupil fitness during holiday periods. It also served to maintain a positive attitude to physical activity out of school.

Greater links with out of school sports clubs established : Wensleydale Rugby and Bedale Squash club

## **Healthy living**

Balance of Good Health Work as part of their Science/Topic/PE Spring 2015. All pupils took part in Skip to Be Fit day which reinforced healthy lifestyles. Majority of pupils now have nutritionally balanced lunch provided by School catering.

## **Staff training**

Further developing links with other local schools to develop Forest Schools, EY joint activities. Evidence bank for Sainsbury's Award being gathered for 2015/16 including house competitions as intra-school sport with Kell Bank. New Sport and PE display in hall with competition timetables, events and celebrating results (from May 2015), regular newsletter slots on website. Also planning of Sports Week summer 2016 with PE Governor.
